HOUSEHOLD SELECTION PROTOCOL:

- Three attempts should be made at different times when you are in the PSU (or on different days) to recruit an eligible respondent from the randomly selected household. Ideally at least one attempt should be made on the weekend, if you are in the area over the weekend.
- If after three attempts it is still not possible to recruit an eligible candidate from the randomly selected household, the household will need to be replaced by counting three households past the *last main household* along the walking path. In each replacement household, the interviewer will make up to three attempts to secure an interview. If the attempts to recruit an eligible respondent at the replacement household are unsuccessful, the interviewer will continue to use the right-hand rule and the interval of three households to select the next replacement household. This process will be repeated until the required number of completed interviews is obtained in the selected PSU.
